Public commitments to seek to become MAC Certified have now been made by 95 companies in 18 countries, including 40 in the United States; 20 in the Philippines; 9 in Indonesia; 5 in Fiji; 3 each in Australia and UK; 2 each in France, Germany and Solomon Islands; and 1 each in Bahrain, Belau, Brazil, Canada, Israel, The Netherlands, Norway, Spain and Taiwan. (MAC) has the following web sites that list the currently certified operations and the ones that have made a commitment to become certified, they are for the certified

I would encourage all of our delegates to check out the list and publish them in their newsletter and encourage their club members to support these dealers.

I will touch on one last thing here and that is the increased interest in the aquarium trade after the release of the movie *Finding Nemo*. Pet shops across the country have reported 50 – 75 % increases in sales since the release of the movie, many retailers are having trouble keeping clown fish in stock. While this could ultimately be a very good thing, I'm betting that in the long run it could do great harm to the tropical fish hobby as a whole. The majority of these people are buying on impulse and have no idea as to the amount of work that they could be in for. I feel that this is one place that the Aquarium Societies can stand up and help out, not only the fish industry but their own Society as well. Start working with your local shops now and encourage them to send people to your Society for help in keeping their pet "Nemo" alive. Tropical Fish Hobbyist Magazine (TFH) is putting together a special supplement to its upcoming December and January issues. This special supplement, called Dream Marine, will be made available free of charge to pet shops across the country, to help potential new hobbyist. I would recommend that your club write to TFH at [info@tfh.com](mailto:info@tfh.com). and request several copies that way you can begin with the upper hand. With a little hard work just

## Delegates' Council Report

The FAAS Report has been having a series called "On The Web" by Rick Borstein, the FAAS Web Master. Because of the nature of the current discussions, I am adding him to this email. (Rick, if you want to be excluded from future discussions of the Council, let me know.) Since the last FAAS Report was published, I have received no additional comments on the recommendations of one of the delegates for a FAAS award for society websites. Because I am also the webmaster of our my society's website, I did not want to push the issue or steer the discussion, lest it appear that I was "stacking the deck" to favor my website. Briefly, the delegates seemed to agree (and if you think that I am incorrect, please feel free to correct me) that if there is one award (for now, let's just call it "Best Society Website"), then there is no need to establish judging criteria. "Best" is what the judge that year decides it is. Period. But, if there are to be more than one award given (say, and overall "Best Website" and maybe "Most Informative," "Most useful," "Easiest to Use Website," etc., than by the very nature of creating these award classes, you are defining some judging criteria. As I wrote in my last report: "...if more than one award is given, then it seems that criteria are implicit in whatever awards are set up. For example, an award for Best Graphics necessarily implies graphics, an award for Most Informative implies resource information, etc." I would, therefore, like to propose that we start off recommending just one award, with no other qualifications or judging restrictions recommended by the Council. If I do not hear from anyone in the two week period after this is published in the FAAS Report, I will assume that no society Delegate has a problem with this starting recommendation.

This is being sent as an email to the FAAS Board and Delegates Council members listed below. If you want to comment, please do so by sending an email reply to "All." While you are free to comment in your society's publication, unless you send a reply to this email to the Council, the other delegates are deprived of the benefit of your thoughts while we are in the process of making up our minds.

**Club Delegate's please take note. The Federation of American Aquarium Societies issues various awards, honors and other forms of recognition for outstanding or exceptional performance on behalf of its member societies, officers, directors, committees and other individuals. All the details of these awards can be found in the current copy of your FAAS Handbook in the section labeled Policies & Procedures Manual, starting with page 18. I would like every delegate out there to read though these awards and discuss making a nomination from your club. Please remember that a club member or club officer may also make nominations. Lets take a brief look at these awards:**

## Delegate's Award

This award is established to recognize outstanding performance by the Delegate of a member society. In another words the Executive Board of your club should take a look at this and consider nominating the clubs delegate for this award.

## National Achievement

This award is established to recognize individuals and societies for outstanding and significant contributions to the hobby on the national level. Nominees need not be members of FAAS prior to or at the time of their nomination. Have any of your club members created or worked on an outstanding project that has a National scope to it.

## Meritorious Service

This award is established to recognize outstanding service to the Federation by an individual or member society of FAAS. This award is the highest honor that FAAS bestows upon its' own members or personnel The nominee must have evidence of unique or outstanding service to FAAS and its' members over the years named in the nomination. This service must be of a higher and more significant nature than that normally expected of members.

## Presidential Citation

This award is established to recognize individuals and societies for outstanding performance in unique circumstances, or single instances, which do not qualify for recognition under the

guidelines for other awards. Nominees need not be members or serving in any capacity in FAAS prior to or at the time of their nomination. This award is presented at the sole discretion of the President of FAAS.

That is not covered by one of the above awards, please by all means contact me and let see if this award will fit.
