# Legislation – July 2001

While things are still slow on the Legislative front as far as a tropical fish go I did find an interesting news story entitled “EXOTIC FISH TRADE GRAPPLES WITH IMAGE, BREEDING”

The trade is big business. World exports of ornamental fish were valued at \$178 million in 1998, according to the U.N. Food and Agriculture Organization. Freshwater fish accounted for 90 percent of all exports, with almost 90 percent of them bred in captivity. “It’s what we call a low-impact, high-value industry,” said, John Dawes, secretary general of the non-profit Ornamental Fish International. John Dawes, organization represents 200 members in 40 countries and includes most of the world’s major aquarium industry players.

The average retail price for food fish was between \$14,500 and \$16,500 per tonne, but ornamental fish typically trade at a hefty \$1.8 million per tonne. While 100 million tons of sea fish are harvested for food each year, some 70,000-100,000 tonnes are caught for aquariums. I think now we can see why there is the interest in the ornamental fish industry. It’s just too bad that it’s only a select few that are really making the money, and it’s for sure not the breeders or collectors.

## **A BAD IMAGE CYANIDE FISHING**

Slowly the Fish industry is trying to change the way it does things and its image, conservationists are waging an ongoing battle to get fishermen to stop using cyanide to stun and collect fish. “More countries in the world use nets than cyanide,” said Vaughan Pratt, president of the International Marinelife Alliance (IMA) “But the two biggest places, Indonesia and the Philippines, export the most fish and end up using the most cyanide.”

Cyanide fishing in the Philippines has since been reduced by almost 70 percent in the past 15 years though the IMA education projects. IMA eight Indonesian education sites are struggling for government support amid the country's political instability.

Another non-profit aquarium industry association, the Marine Aquarium Council, is working on certification standards to ensure fish are not collected with cyanide and hopes to eventually reward the fishing community with more cash for net-caught fish.

## **GENETIC MANIPULATION**

Profits from the genetic manipulation of fish bred in captivity have landed in the hands of ornamental breeders, SAID Dr. Paulo Petry, a project investigator with Bio-Amazonia Conservation International.

Singapore, the world's largest exporter of ornamental fish with 30 percent of the global supply, has already produced numerous lucrative new varieties through selective breeding.

The technology, which permanently embeds a green fluorescent gene from a jellyfish and the red color from a sea anemone into the zebra fish, can be used on other species, researchers say.

“Ornamental fish is something like fashion. You need to come up with new fish varieties from time to time,” said Lim Lian Chuan, head of the Agrifood and Veterinary Authority of Singapore's (AVA) freshwater fisheries centre.

The AVA has been actively pushing local ornamental fish breeders to dabble with cutting edge breeding techniques even as industry players ponder whether or not to encourage and trade the modified fish.

## **ON THE RELEASE OF EXOTIC'S**

The release of exotic fish is something that every fish club needs to work with its members and community on. This is a

growing problem and is not only confined to the warmer climate states

Any plant or animal that is not native to the United States is considered an exotic species. Most fishes available for sale in pet shops are exotic and are imported predominantly from Central and South America, Africa, and southeast Asia. Each year, over 2000 species, representing nearly 150 million exotic freshwater and marine fishes, are imported into the United States for use in the aquarium trade. Fish culture in Florida also results in millions of exotic fish available for sale in the industry.

Unfortunately, a number of exotic fishes are released into the wild each year. Hobbyists may not be able to take their fish with them when they move, or they simply may lose interest in maintaining an aquarium. Fish may also be released if they outgrow the e aquarium or if they appear to be in poor health. Whatever the reason, releasing exotic fish into local waters is not a good idea. It also is illegal in just about every state in the country.

Currently, at least 185 different species of exotic fishes have been caught in open waters of the United States, and 75 of these are known to have established breeding populations. Over half of these introductions are due to the release or escape of aquarium fishes. Examples include a number of cichlid, such as the oscar, Jack Dempsey, jewelfish, convict cichlid, Midas cichlid, and spotted tilapia; and livebearers, such as swordtails, platies and mollies, and armored catfishes. The goldfish, a native of China, is one of the few examples of a temperate aquarium species that is established throughout the United States.

Instead of subjecting the fish to potentially harmful environmental conditions or risking potential ecological problems by releasing it, there are alternative means for disposing of unwanted pet fish:

Return it to a local pet shop for resale or trade.

Give it to another hobbyist, or an aquarium society. They can

find a good home for it or sell it at there auction

Donate it to a public institution, such as a school, nursing home, hospital, or prison.
